Installation of your Product

In today's modern vehicles, it is very easy to cause damage to existing systems through improper installation. Please follow and scrutinize all wiring diagrams to ensure that you have connected everything in its proper place.

If you find yourself uncomfortable of unfamiliar with understanding the wiring and installation diagrams or testing instructions, do contact your nearest Nakamichi dealer to perform the installation for you.

Safety Warnings and Considerations

- Clean only with a dry cloth or other similar materials.
- Install your product in a dry, well-ventilated location that does not interfere with your vehicle's safety equipment.
- Do not block any ventilation openings when installing this product.
- Do not mount the product in the engine compartment of your vehicle or in any areas of extreme heat such as mufflers, silencers, exhaust pipes or other heat producing apparatus.
- Securely mount the product so that it does not come loose in the event of a collision or as a result of repeated vibrations that might occur during normal operation.





BATTERY REPLACEMENT

NO. SYMBOL OPERATION & CONTROL MODES

1. **(b)** When the unit is turn off, press to turn on the unit.

When the unit is turn on, press & hold shortly to turn off the unit.

During unit operation, press to turn on or off of sound mute control.

2. SOURCE Press repeatedly to select the desired mode for operation.

3. SYS TV Mode

Press repeatedly to select TV system (PAL / SECAM / NTSC) that suit your country / area.

CLR Bluetooth Mode

Press to erase the digit input by error.

LOUD Press & hold shortly to turn on or off of loudness control.
 EQ Press repeatedly to select the desired preset equalization mode.

5. AUDIO Video & Music Playback Mode

Each time press & hold shortly to select different audio output channels. (Note: Available on input device or media files recorded with different output channels and this selection is not available under Bluetooth mode)

6. OSD At media playback mode, press & hold shortly to display the contents of the playback details on screen.

(Note: Not available at music playback mode)

7. 1 – 6 <u>Radio Mode</u>

Press any one of the number key 1-6 to select a station that had been stored in the preset memory number key 1-6 for broadcasting.

0-9 <u>DISC/ USB / SD / Input Mode</u>

Press directly to input the number of track for playback.

NO. SYMBOL OPERATION & CONTROL MODES

0-9 <u>Bluetooth Mode</u>

Press directly to input the phone number for dial out.

TV Mode

Press directly to input the number of channel that had been

memorized for broadcasting.

8. ZOOM <u>DISC/ USB / SD Input Mode</u>

At video & photo playback, each time press & hold shortly to select various zoom in and zoom out of screen for viewing.

Q Radio Mode

Press to start intro broadcasting on the preset stations on memory. Press & hold shortly to start searching the frequency and storing the strongest signal stations into the preset memory stations number 1-6. After storing the stations, the unit starts intro broadcasting on all the preset memory stations.

TV Mode

Press & hold shortly to start intro broadcasting on all the preset channels on memory.

9. BND <u>Radio Mode</u>

Press repeatedly to select the desired radio band for broadcasting. Note: When the unit is under other operation mode, press to shift current operation mode to radio mode for operation (not available at disc / USB / SD input mode).

DISC/ USB / SD Input Mode

At video playback mode under disc input, press to stop playback. At music / photo playback mode under disc input and playback mode under USB / SD input, press to stop playback temporary and shift to playlist for playback selection, normal playback will resume after a few seconds. (Note: Depended on the input device & playback media, playlist may not be available).

DISCBluetooth Music Playback Mode

Press to stop playback and will shift back to previous operation mode.

Bluetooth Mode

Press to hang up or refuse an incoming call.

10. RDM At DISC / USB / SD input playback mode, press & hold shortly to turn

on or off of random playback of the input device.

11. INT At music playback mode, press & hold shortly to turn on or off of intro playback of the input device. (Note: Not available at Bluetooth mode).

12. ►II At DISC / USB / SD / input & Bluetooth mode, press to pause, resume or start playback.

At DVD menu/title display mode, press to select the desired setting/ setup and press ENT to confirm/enter.

Folder / Playlist Mode

During folder/playlist display at media playback mode, press repeatedly to select track for playback. Once selected, press ENT to confirm.

Photo Playback Mode

Press to rotate photo position or show up-down, left-right mirror image.

14. ENT DVD Mode / Folder/Playlist Mode

At DVD menu/title display mode as well as folder/playlist display at media playback mode, press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown/\blacktriangleright/\blacktriangleleft$ to select the desired setting/setup and press ENT to confirm/enter.

15. ►► / ► Radio Mode

Press repeatedly to fine tune radio frequency upward or downward. Press & hold shortly to tune radio frequency to the upward or downward station for broadcasting.

DISC / USB / SD Input Mode (Playback Mode)

Press repeatedly to shift track upward or downward for playback. Press & hold shortly to activate fast forward or fast rewind mode. At this mode, press repeatedly to select various speeds of fast forward or fast rewind. (Note: Not available for operate at photo playback mode).

TV Mode

Press to shift TV channel upward or downward for broadcasting. Press & hold shortly to shift to the upward or downward channel for broadcasting.

Bluetooth Mode

Press to shift track upward or downward for playback.

16. REP At playback mode under disc / USB / SD input, each time press & hold shortly to activate various repeat playback setting.

17. ANGLE At video playback mode, each time press & hold shortly to view angle changes in sequential order (available on media files recorded with this features).

18. TITLE Radio Mode

Press to select stereo (ST) or mono mode at FM radio band. (Note: At stereo mode and when stereo signal received, stereo indicator appeared on screen whereas this is not indication for mono mode and mono signal received).

NO. SYMBOL OPERATION & CONTROL MODES

18. TITLE <u>DVD Mode</u>

Press & hold shortly to display on screen the menu of the entire disc

and resume playback after a while.

19. SUB-T Radio Mode

Press to select local setting for reception of strong signal stations

and distant setting for reception of weak signal stations. (Note: LOC appears on screen on local setting whereas no

indication for distant setting).

Video Playback Mode

Each time press & hold shortly to select different sub-titles that recoded in the input device or media files. (Note: Available on

input device or media files recorded with sub-titles).

20. SLOW At video playback mode, each time press & hold shortly to select

different speeds on slow motion playback.

21. VOL + / VOL - Press repeatedly or press & hold to adjust sound output level.

22. MENU / PBC DVD Mode

Press & hold shortly to display on screen the menu of the entire disc

& resume playback after a while.

VCD Mode

Press to turn on or off of PBC playback.

23. SETUP During unit operation, press & hold shortly to activate setup menu

on screen for various system setup. Press & hold shortly again to return to previous operation mode. (Note: System setup cannot be operated by remote handset. System setup can only be operated by touch screen – refer to ON SCREEN OPERATION for details).

24. Bluetooth Mode

During unit operation, press to shift to Bluetooth mode for operation. Press to pick up an incoming call; dial out after input a phone

number: redial last dial out number

→ / PHONE Bluetooth Conversation Mode

Press to shift conversation between main unit and mobile phone.

Remarks: Depends on the input devices & playback media files, operation may be varied or not available for operation.



RST Press with a pointed object (such as a ball point) to reset the unit to

its initial setting by the factory (default stage).

▲ / EJECT Press to eject disc from the disc slot (when a disc has been inserted).

Vol + Increment the Volume level (0~50).

Turn Power on or off. During power OFF, Press power button to turn

ON the head unit. During the unit is ON,long press power button to

turn OFF the head unit.

Vol – Decrement the Volume level(50~0).

■/ Touch the Home button to enter to the Main Menu.

When apple Carplay or Android auto available, Hold the voice

button to start the voice control function.

USB Insert USB device to this slot for digital files playback.

(Note: The USB slot is intended for data transfer only.)

AUX Insert an external device to this port in order to have sound output





Plug the iPhone (iPhone 5 or later models, and ios 7.1 or above) through the lightening cable to the USB port of the Head unit. The iPhone will be shown the "CarPlay". The Head unit will enter the CarPlay interface, the APP that support the CarPlay feature will be displayed on the Head Unit as shown below Touch the corresponding APP can operation the operation, touch the ① button to go back to the CarPlay interface.





Siri

In CarPlay mode, user can talk to SIRI to control the CarPlay function. Press & button to start the SIRI function, or touch the • button for 2 seconds or the Home button of iPhone in the CarPlay Home screen to talk to SIRI for playing music, i will go

Notice: For the SIRI function in the Head unit, the Microphone has to been connected. In CarPlay mode, touch "HOME/SIRI" button or • icon to enter the Head unit main menu.

Balance / Fader:

Touch the + or - of Balance / Fade to tune for the driver and passenger preference.

The value of Balance (Left 15 \sim Right 15) and Fade (Front 15 \sim Rear 15). Touch Reset to set both balance and fade to zer.

10-Band Equalizer 10 band of EQ tuning, slide the EQ bar to tune each band frequency level according to user preference. Touch Reset to set all Band to 0.



BT Audio Settings



Touch the BT Audio icon to enter Bluetooth Audio playing mode. If the Bluetooth is connected, the music will be playing at the left side.



If the Bluetooth is not connected, press Reconnect to connect the paired phone or Pairing to pair the new device.



Turn On the Bluetooth of the Mobile phone/ Bluetooth device, you can see the NA6605. Select the NA6605 for pairing and connection.

Press Pairing and the Pairing Mode screen will be shown as above.

Touch the Phone icon in main menu to go to Phone mode. After the phone connected with the Head Unit via Bluetooth (HFP), user can through the head unit to make a phone call. Please note it needs to connect the microphone for phone call.

Dial a Call

- Touch the Keyboard icon to the above screen will appear.
- Once the correct number appears on the screen, touch the \(\) icon. To go back dialing interface, touch the return icon at the upper right corner of the screen.
- To end the call, touch the nicon on the screen.



Install Android Auto

User need to install the Android Auto App to the android phone. When the android phone first time connected to the na6605 via USB, the phone will show a website link to download the android Auto application pack from Google Play. Download and stall the apk file on the android phone. After installed the Android auto, the Android phone can use the android Auto function

Connection

Connect the Android phone and head unit via USB cable, the Android phone display will be shown on the Head unit screen User also allows using the touch panel of the head unit to control the android phone.





The Audio/Video source with RCA cable can through the head unit to play the Audio/Video. Plug the RCA to the corresponding A/V socket.


Touch AuxIn icon to view the playing audio/ Video. The audio and video will via the RCA cable to the head unit.
