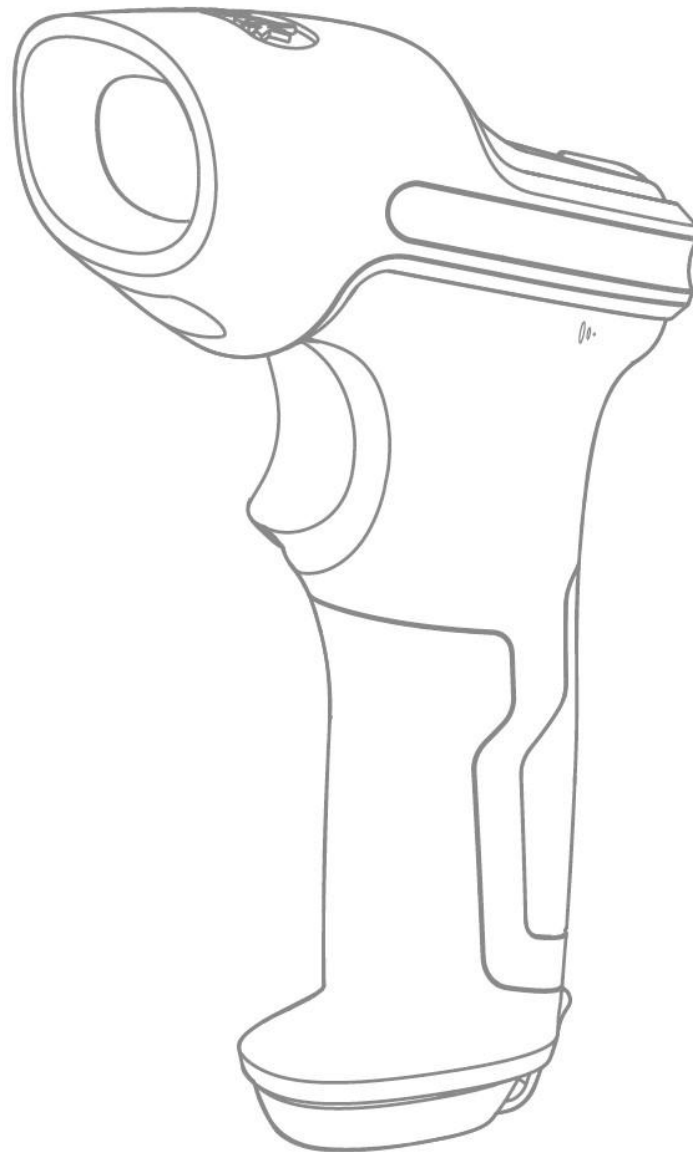

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## **IMPORTANT NOTICE**

### **Safety Precaution**

DO NOT disassemble the scanner, or place foreign matter into it in case of short circuit or other circuit damage.

DO NOT expose the scanner or battery to any flammable sources.

### **Maintenance Precaution**

The exterior body of the barcode scanner can be cleaned with a wet cloth.

The power switch should be toggled to OFF mode if the barcode scanner will not be used for a long time.

Please record the specific scenario and consult the after sales team should you encounter anything abnormal regarding the barcode scanner.

## **Overview of Inateck P7 barcode Scanner**

### **Features of the Scanner**

There are four types of scanning mode, including Red Light Auto-off Mode, Continuous Scanning Mode, Manual Mode and Hands-free Mode.

There are four data transmission modes, including 433MHz wireless mode, Bluetooth HID mode, Bluetooth SPP mode, and USB mode.

Eight types of keyboards are supported: US keyboard, UK keyboard, Canadian keyboard, German keyboard, French keyboard, Spanish keyboard, Italian keyboard, and Japanese keyboard.

Compatible with Windows, Mac OS, Linux, Android, and iOS.

Feedback mechanism is made by LED indicator, beeper, and vibration motor. The volume can be well adjusted through barcode settings.

Up to 32 digits prefix and suffix can be customized freely. Up to 99 digits of start & stop characters in the barcodes can be deleted in the scanning result.

Thanks to the built-in 32 Mb memory, the barcode scanner can store up to 270,000 13-character barcodes, when it is offline or under inventory mode.

The settings of scanning mode, barcode type and data transmitting format are made by scanning correspondent barcodes.

## Introduction of Key Function

Power Switch: Toggle it to “On” mode to get the barcode scanner started; toggle it to “Off” mode to turn off the barcode scanner.

Scanning Trigger:

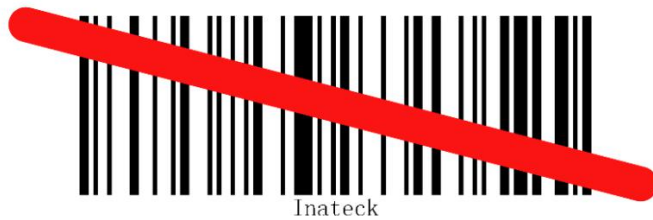
1. Short press the trigger and a beam of red light emits, and the barcode scanner is ready to scan barcodes.
2. Double-press the trigger to upload the buffer data.
3. Press and hold the trigger for 1 second to pop up/hide the virtual keyboard (This function is only available when the barcode scanner is connected to an iOS device in Bluetooth HID mode, please check Chapter 2.2). Press and hold the trigger for 5 seconds to enter the Bluetooth pairing state (This function is only available when the Bluetooth is disconnected in Bluetooth HID mode).

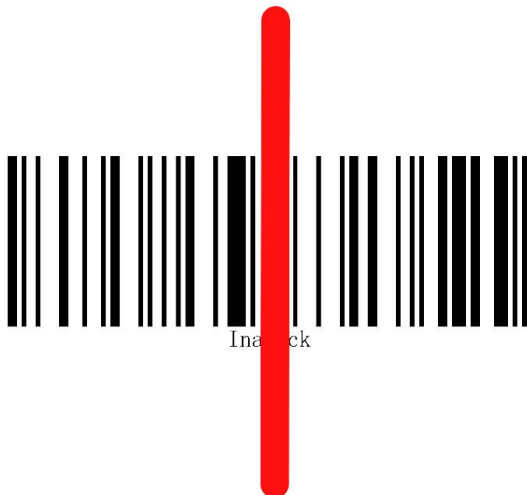

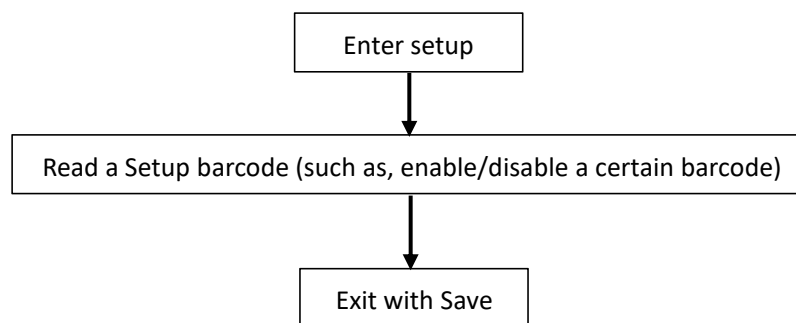
## QUICK START

The settings of the Inateck P7 Barcode Scanner can be changed by scanning the setup barcodes included in this manual. This section describes the procedure of setting the Inateck P7 Barcode Scanner by scanning the setup barcodes. Examples are demonstrated as below.



Step	Operation	Feedback on successful operation
1	Toggle the Power Switch to “On” mode to get the scanner started and press the Trigger.	Inateck P7 will emit a red light.
2	Read the barcode, enter the setting mode  Enter setup	The P7 will respond with three chord sounds, and the LED indicator turns blue.
3	Read certain function setup barcode, such as:  Enable Codabar	The P7 will respond with two beeps (tone ascending from low to high).
4	Scan “Exit with save” barcode to finish the setup  Exit with save	The P7 will respond with three chord sounds, and the blue LED indicator will be off automatically.
Note: The Inateck P7 Barcode Scanner will respond with a long beep if any setup error occurs.

## Enter the Setting Mode

“Enter setup” barcode exists here and in the following chapters. The Inateck P7 barcode scanner will enter into setting mode once this barcode is scanned successfully.

When scanning the barcode successfully, the Inateck P7 barcode scanner will respond with three chord sounds, and the LED indicator turns blue.

Instruction below explains other function settings of the Inateck P7 barcode scanner.

## Exit with Save

“Exit with Save” barcode exists here and in the following chapters. The Inateck P7 barcode scanner will exit setting mode once this barcode is scanned successfully.

When scanning the barcode successfully, the Inateck P7 barcode scanner will respond with three chord sounds, and the LED indicator turns blue.

## Exit without Save

When error setup occurs, please scan the “Exit without save” barcode. The Inateck P7 Barcode Scanner will respond with three chord sounds, and the blue LED indicator will be off.

## To Save Custom Settings

When use the P7 barcode scanner, you may customize some functions and restore them when needed. To do that, you just need to scan the setting barcode "Enter setup", and then scan the function barcode needed, e.g. "Enable Code ID", and then scan "Save custom settings". Afterwards, P7 will exit the setting mode after successful operation.

If you want to return to the custom settings while the barcode scanner has been reset, just scan the barcode "Enter setup", and then scan "Restore custom settings". The P7 will exit the setting mode after successful operation.

## Restore Factory Defaults

Scan the barcodes "Enter setup" and "Restore factory defaults" in sequence. The P7 will respond with two short beeps (tone ascending from low to high) and three chord sounds after successful setting. There is no need to scan the "Exit with save" barcode in this case.

Note: Most of the settings have factory default value. The default value for each setting is marked by an asterisk "\*". After restoring to the factory default, the P7 will switch to 433MHz wireless mode.

"Restore Factory Defaults" barcode can be used under following circumstances:

1. The scanner doesn't work. For example, it cannot read/ scan any barcodes.
2. You forget what settings you ever make on the scanner, while you don't want to be disturbed by the forgotten settings when you use the barcode scanner.
3. You are going to use a function that is not frequently used, or you have finished using such a function.

## Check Software Version

If you want to check the software version of Inateck P7, you should scan the "Enter Setup" and "Output Software Version" barcode, then you will get it on the device connected with the P7.

"Check Software Version" is done in the enter setup mode, so please scan "Exit without Save" barcode after the software version outputs.

# Chapter 1 Features and Basic Setups

This chapter introduces the features and usage of the P7 barcode scanner.

## 1.1 Battery

The P7 barcode scanner is powered by 2600mAh chargeable Lithium batteries. If you use the red light auto-off mode, the barcode scanner can work 107 hours continuously under 433MHz wireless mode, when it can read 192,600 barcodes (read a barcode Code 128 every 2s).

### 1.1.1 To recharge

To recharge the barcode scanner, please use the USB cable included, and connect the barcode scanner to the USB port of a working computer or a 5V charger. When the barcode scanner is being recharged, the red LED indicator is on. It goes off when the barcode scanner is fully recharged.

### 1.1.2 Auto Sleep Mode

In order to save energy, users can specify the time interval for the scanner to automatically turn off. The default one is 3 minutes.

Eg. Steps to set 5 minutes for the scanner to be automatically turn off are as below.

1. Read the "Enter Setup" barcode;
2. Read the "Set 5 min to be auto-off";
3. Read the "Exit with Save" barcode.

Tips: If you want to keep the scanner being powered on all the time, scan "Exit Auto Sleep mode" barcode instead of step 2.

### 1.1.3 Battery Level Display

Scan the "Battery Level Display" barcode (there is no need to scan "Enter setup" barcode), the battery level will display on the device connected with the P7.

## 1.2 Data Buffer

P7 adopts 32Mb memory as its data buffer. Upon reading a barcode successfully, the P7 scanner will upload the data to the computer/phone if the receiver is within the transmission range, then the scanner will respond with one short beep (high tone) and the green LED indicator will flash once. If the receiver is out of the transmission range, all the data scanned will be stored in the buffer, the P7 will respond with two short beeps (tone from high to low) and the blue LED indicator will flash once. When the buffer is full, the P7 will respond with a long beep (high tone) to remind that the space of the buffer is not enough and cannot store any more barcodes. The

user should return to the transmission range quickly to upload the scanned data to computer/phone. Then, the space of buffer can be released.

Note: The 32 Mb memory can store up to 13-character 270,000 barcodes.

You can enable/disable Clear Data in Buffer when turn on the barcode scanner.

When the connection is completed, it is necessary to double click the trigger if you want to upload the data to computer as the data in the buffer won't be uploaded automatically. You can also set whether to upload the data automatically by scanning the following barcodes. The default is "Disable Auto Uploading Buffer Data".

If you want to upload the data in buffer automatically after successful connection, please set "Enable Auto Uploading Buffer Data".

## 1.2.1 Inventory Mode

If you want to keep the scanned result in the buffer of the barcode scanner, you can choose inventory mode. In inventory mode, Inateck P7 will count the number of the barcodes automatically. Users may use inventory mode to keep scanned barcodes in the buffer of Inateck P7, and upload them to computer in batches. Under inventory mode, users are not restricted to the time and location when upload data. Of course, history data can be cleared in buffer after uploading. More details about inventory mode are as below.

- 1) Scan the "Enter Inventory Mode" barcode to enter Inventory Mode

- 2) Scan the barcode to return to Common Mode

- 3) Scan the barcode to clear data in buffer (for Inventory Mode only).

- 4) Scan the "Data Upload (for Inventory Mode only)" barcode to upload data from buffer (for Inventory Mode only).

- 5) Scan the barcode to upload the number of scanned barcodes (for Inventory Mode only)

Note: For achieve these five functions above, you can just scan the setting barcode. There is no need to scan "Enter setup" and "Exit with save".

### 1.3 LED Indicator

The LED indicators on Inateck P7 can help the user know more about the current operation status.

LED Status	Meaning
Green LED blinks	Ever paired but not successfully connected this time
Green LED flashes once	Barcode successfully read and uploaded to computer/phone
Blue LED blinks	Bluetooth broadcasting and could be found by other devices
Bluetooth LED flashes once	Barcode successfully read and saved in buffer
Blue LED stays on	On setup status
Yellow LED blinks	Low battery
Red LED stays on	In Charge ( Red LED off when battery is full )

### 1.4 Beeper

The built-in beeper in the P7 can help the user to know about the current operation status.

Beeping	Meaning
One short high note(100ms)	Read barcode successfully
One short high note (20ms)	Data upload from scanner to host
One long high note (400ms)	Wrong Setup (on setup status, blue LED stays on) 433MHz Pairing Failure (Occurs only during the pairing process) Invalid scanning due to full buffer. (Scanned barcode not saved)
Two or several long high notes (800ms)	USB being configured
Three chord sounds (tone from low to high)	Enter setup mode (Blue LED on) Exit setup mode (Blue LED off)
Three chord sounds (tone from high to low)	Bluetooth connected
Two short notes (the same tone)	Bluetooth disconnected
Two short notes (tone from low to high)	Correct setup
Two short notes (tone from high to low)	The connection between Inateck P7 and computer/phone is disrupted.

For example: Steps to set Minimum Volume for beeper are as below:

1. Read the "Enter Setup" barcode;
2. Read the "Minimum Volume" barcode;
3. Read the "Exit with Save" barcode.

Note: The factory default value for each setting is marked by an asterisk "\*".

### 1.5 Vibration Notification

The P7 barcode scanner is featured with vibration notification which is turned on by default, to indicate successful scanning. You can enable/disable this function and adjust the vibration strength.

The steps to turn off the vibration notification are as follows:

- 1) Read "Enter setup" barcode.
- 2) Read "Turn off the vibration notification" barcode.
- 3) Read "Enter with save" barcode.

## 1.6 Scanning Modes

Four kinds of scanning modes are supported by the Inateck P7 Barcode Scanner, including red light auto-off mode, continuous scanning mode, manual mode, and hands-free mode.

### 1.6.1 Red Light Auto-off Mode

By default, the scanning mode is set to Red Light Auto-off Mode. If the user presses the Scanning Trigger, the red light would be turned on. If a barcode is not successfully scanned, the red light will be off automatically after red light auto-off waiting time, which usually defaults to 2 seconds and can be set to 1s, 2s, 3s and 5s. Yet the red light will be off soon if Inateck P7 scans a barcode.

E.g.: To set the scanning mode to Red Light Auto-off mode and set the Red Light auto-off waiting time to 1s, you need to:

1. Read the "Enter Setup" barcode;
2. Read the "Red Light Auto-off Mode" barcode;
3. Read the "Setup Auto laser-off waiting time" barcode;
4. Read the "1s" barcode;
5. Read the "Exit with Save" barcode.

## 1.6.2 Continuous Scanning Mode

There's no need to press the scanning trigger in this mode, As the red light of the scanner will be on and the scanner will enter into scanning mode automatically.

The red light of the scanner will not go off until Inateck P7 scans a barcode. And the laser will go off once the scanner scans barcode successfully. And then the scanner will go into waiting mode, in which the waiting time (also known as intermittent time of continuous scanning), usually defaults to 2 seconds, and can be set to 400ms, 800ms, 1s, 2s, 3s, 5s, 10s and 15s.

The red light of the scanner will be on again once the waiting time is over. It will only go off when the scanner scans a barcode successfully. And it will go back and forth like this.

Example of setting the scanner into Continuous Scanning mode and setting the Intermittent time to 1s:

1. Read the "Enter Setup" barcode;
2. Read the "Continuous Scanning Mode" barcode;
3. Read the "Setup Intermittent time of Continuous scanning " barcode;
4. Read the "1s" barcode;
5. Read the "Exit with Save" barcode.

Note: The factory default value for each setting is indicated by an asterisk "\*".

### 1.6.3 Manual Mode

Under Manual Mode, the Inateck P7 Scanner will emit a red-light line which indicates the scanner can scan if the user keeps pressing the Trigger. The scanning status will not end until you operate the barcode scanner like below.

- \* Read a barcode successfully;
- \* Release the Trigger;

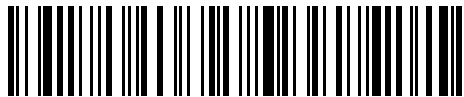

For Example, if you want to set the scanner into manual mode, you need to:

1. Read the "Enter Setup" barcode;
2. Read the "Manual Mode" barcode;
3. Read the "Exit with Save" barcode.

### 1.6.4 Hands-free Mode

Under the Hands-free Mode, the red light still stays on after the P7 reads a barcode successfully, but it won't read it repeatedly. You can scan the barcode below to set the scanner into Hands-free Mode.

For Example, if you want to set the scanner into Hands-free mode, you may need to:

1. Read the "Enter Setup" barcode;
2. Read the "Hands-free Mode" barcode;
3. Read the "Exit with Save" barcode.

## 1.7 Types of Keyboard

Inateck P7 is compatible with Windows, Android, iOS, and MacOS. The working mode is for Windows/Android by default. You can change it by scanning the barcodes below.



(\*) Windows/Android mode



MacOS / iOS mode

To run P7 with MacOS/iOS devices, please follow the steps:

- 1) Scan “enter setup”;
- 2) Scan “MacOS/iOS device mode”;
- 3) Scan “Save and exit” .

Note: If you are to use P7 with Android devices, make sure to apply Gboard as the input method. Apart from setting the scanner under “Windows/Android” mode, you also need to set the scanner keyboard language as American English that supports “Gboard” input method. The language settings of Gboard won’t affect the output.

Inateck P7 support six international keyboards: US Keyboard, German Keyboard, French Keyboard, Spanish Keyboard, Italian Keyboard, UK English Keyboard, with US Keyboard as default. You are suggested to set the keyboard type of the scanner to be in agreement with that in real use by scanning the correspondent barcode listed below.

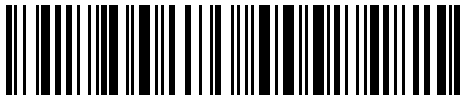

1. Scan the “Enter Setup” barcode;
2. Scan the “German Keyboard” barcode;
3. Scan the “Exit with Save” barcode to end language setting.

## Chapter 2 How to Connect

### 2.1 433MHz Wireless Mode

433MHz wireless mode is the default connection mode of P7 barcode scanner. If you are using other connection modes and want to switch it back to the 433MHz wireless mode, please scan the setting barcodes in sequence "Enter Setup" - "433MHz Wireless Mode" - "Exit with Save".

Under this mode, you need to plug the receiver into the USB port of a computer. When the USB is configured successfully, the indicator light on the receiver will flash once and then go off. Open a new text on your computer, move the cursor to the blank area on the text, the scanned data will be transmitted to the text file.

#### 2.1.1 433MHz Wireless Pairing

The P7 has been paired with its receiver before leaving the factory. If you replace the receiver, please re-pair it with the P7. The pairing method is flexible, which allows you to pair one or more P7 scanners with one receiver, also you can pair one scanner with multiple receivers (up to 8 receivers can be paired).

Steps to Pair one scanner with one USB adapter:

- a. Plug the adapter into your computer.
- b. Scan "Enter Setup" barcode.
- c. Scan the barcode "Pair one or more scanners with one USB adapter", and get the Inateck P7 as close as possible to the USB adapter (within 2 meters).
- d. A three-chord sound (from low to high) indicates a successful pairing. Once there is a long high tone, it means the pairing fails and a repeated operation is needed.



### Pair one or more scanners with one USB adapter

To pair more scanners with the adapter, please operate as the steps mentioned above.

#### Steps to pair one scanner with multiple USB adapters

- a. Unplug the previous USB adapter.
- b. Scan "Enter Setup" barcode.
- c. Scan the barcode "Pair one scanner with multiple USB adapters", and get the Inateck P7 as close as possible to the USB adapter (within 2 meters).
- d. Insert the USB adapter into a computer. The indicator of the adapter flashes along with a short high tone, which indicates a successful pairing.
- e. Unplug the adapter (no operation is required on the barcode scanner in this process), and then plug the second adapter into the computer, a short high tone indicates another successful pairing. Then repeat this process to pair the next adapter.
- f. If all the adapters have been paired with the P7 barcode scanner, please short press the trigger on the barcode scanner, and the pairing stops.

Note: The more USB adapters a P7 barcode scanner is connected with, the longer transmission time it takes and the longer time you need to wait after scanning.

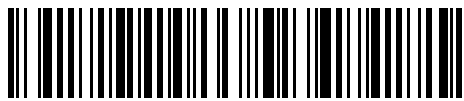

## 2.1.1 433MHz Wireless Channel Change

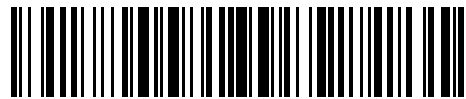
There are 6 channels available when the P7 is in the 433MHz wireless mode, and the default is "channel 0". If you want to use multiple P7 scanners in the same place, it is suggested to set every barcode scanner to different channels so as to avoid wireless signal interference.

Steps to set the working channel to "channel 1": Firstly, make sure the USB adapter is within the connection range. Then read the barcode "Enter setup, "Set 433MHz channel", "Channel 1" to set the channel. P7 will exit the setting status automatically after the successful setting.

Note: Switching channel only works for the paired USB dongles. If a P7 is paired with multiple USB dongles, you can plug all the paired dongles into computers and set it once, and all the dongles could switch channels.

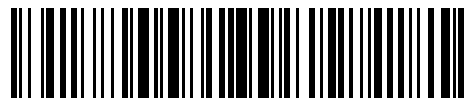

## 2.2 Bluetooth HID Mode

Bluetooth HID mode is not the default mode. To enter this mode, please read the barcode "Enter setup", "Bluetooth HID Mode" and "Exit with save".

If you do not pair the P7 with any device via Bluetooth, after switching to Bluetooth HID mode, the P7 will enter into Bluetooth broadcasting mode automatically and the blue LED indicator flashes. Then you can search the Bluetooth of P7 and get it paired on your phone/computer. The P7 will respond with three chord sounds (from high to low), which indicates the successful pairing. After that, you can open a text on the connected computer or phone and move the cursor the blank area on the text file, and the barcode data would be output there after a scan. Note: The P7 will connect with the previous paired device automatically if you have done the pairing before.

If you want to connect the P7 with other device, please read the barcode " Enter setup" and "Pair one or more scanners with one USB adapter", the P7 will enter into Bluetooth broadcasting mode, then you can get the P7 paired on your phone/computer.

If the Bluetooth of P7 disconnected, long press the trigger for 5s to enable the Bluetooth of P7 again, and then you can search the P7 on the phone/computer and pair it again without repeating the previous setting steps.

Note: If you have done the pairing with P7 previously, please remove the pairing history of the same P7 in the list of host device.

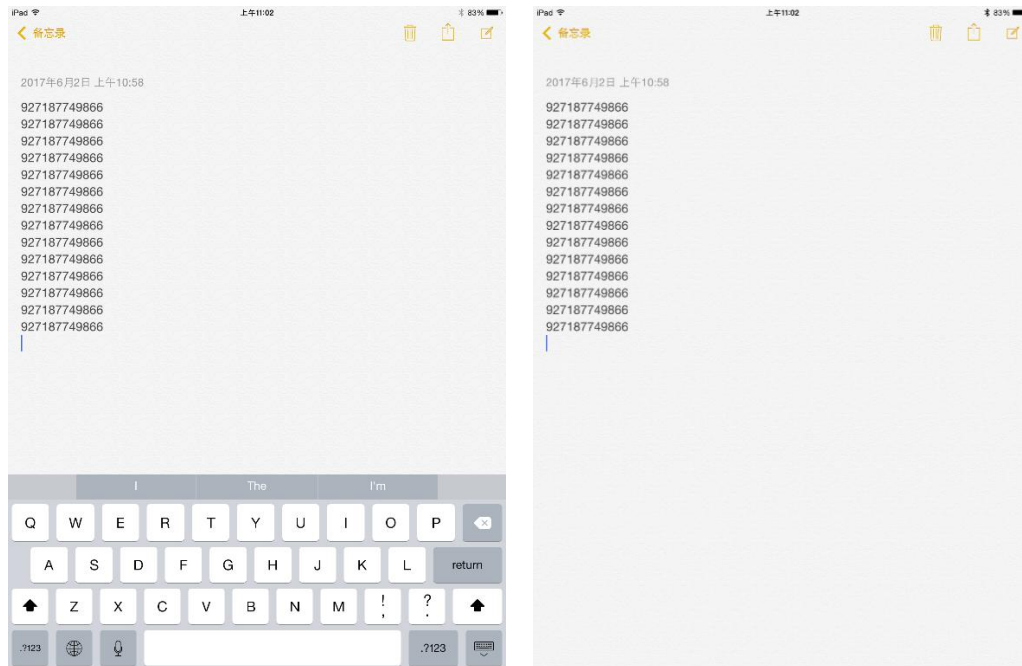

Under Bluetooth HID mode, the phone will hide its virtual keyboard after connected with P7. If you are using an iOS device, just long press the trigger for 1s to pop out the virtual keyboard during the scanning process. Long press the trigger for 1s again to hide the virtual keyboard. As shown below:



If you are using an Android device, to enable the virtual keyboard, please follow these steps:

1. Open the Settings app on your Android device.
2. Select the language and input method. Operate the following steps according to the version of Android you are using.

Android 7.0 and above: Select Physical Keyboard → Display Virtual Keyboard.

Android 6.0 and above: Select the current keyboard → hardware (display input method).

### 2.3 Bluetooth SPP Mode

Bluetooth SPP mode is not the default mode. To enter this mode, please read the barcode “Enter setup”, “Bluetooth SPP Mode” and “Exit with save”.

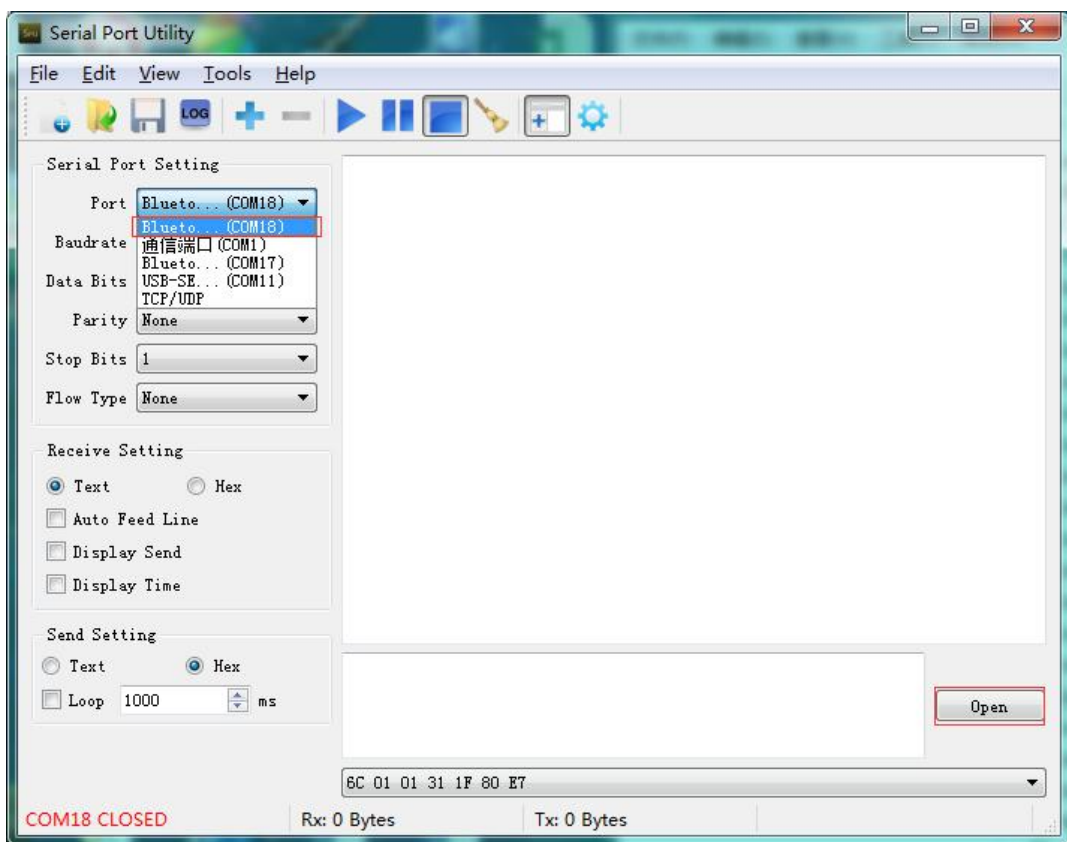

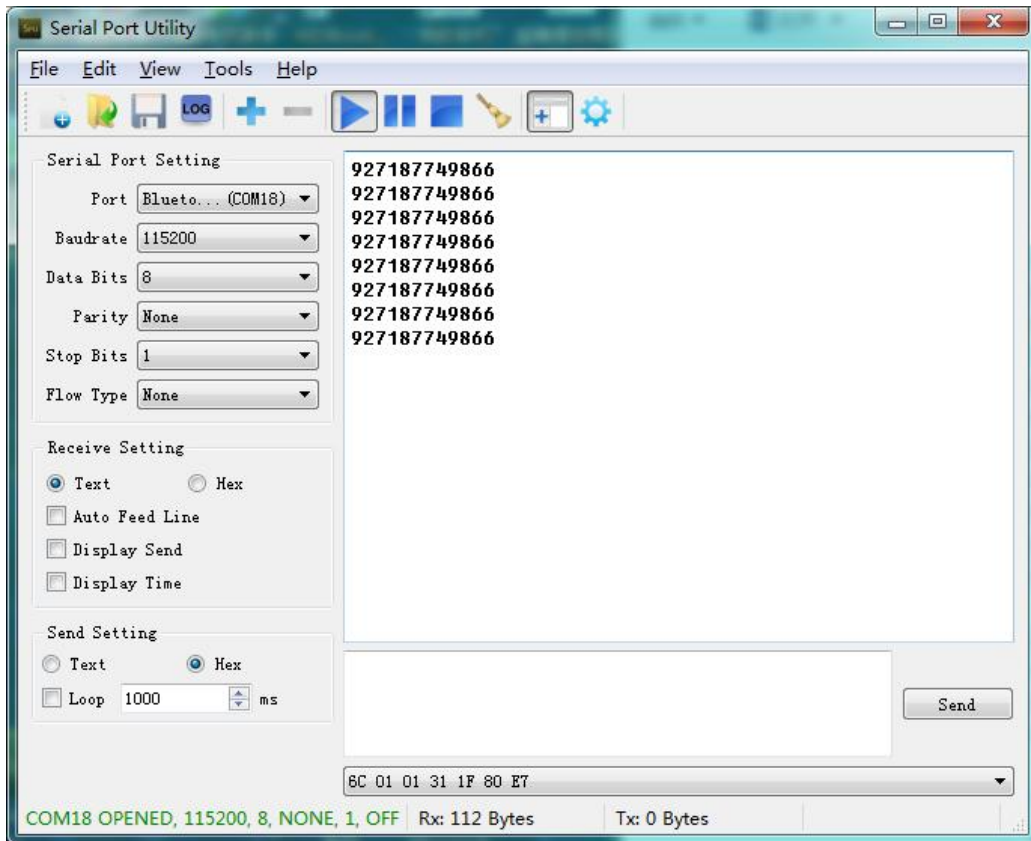

When switched to Bluetooth SPP mode, the P7 will enter into Bluetooth broadcasting mode and the blue LED indicator flashes. Then you can search the Bluetooth of P7 and get it paired on your phone/computer. After successful pairing, you need to run serial debugging tool on your computer, and select Open Bluetooth COM Port. You will then hear three chord sounds (from high to low) to indicate the successful Bluetooth connection.

Note: There might be two Bluetooth COM ports on the list. If the connection fails, please try the other COM port.



After the successful connection, you can scan the barcodes which will be displayed on the serial debugging tool as follows:



To disconnect the Bluetooth, just close the serial debugging tool.

To use the Bluetooth SPP mode of P7 on another computer, there is no more operation needed for P7, just disconnect the P7 on the previous connected computer, and then the P7 will enter Bluetooth broadcasting mode. Search P7 and pair it on another computer. After successful pairing, you need to run serial debugging tool on the new computer and follow the steps to Open Bluetooth COM Port as mentioned above.

## 2.4 USB Mode

If the P7 is connected to a computer via USB cable, the data transmission through USB mode is preferred. Under the USB connection mode, the P7 will respond with two or multiple long high tones which indicates the USB is being configured. You can begin to use the P7 scanner after the prompt tones stop. Open a text file on computer and move cursor to the blank where scanning output should be placed. Scanning results can be displayed on computer then.



## 2.5 Transmission Speed

The scanner works in high speed transmission mode by default with default data transmission interval at 0 ms. If you want to use the scanner with some low-speed software (like Excel on Android devices), please adjust the transmission interval of the scanner to avoid data loss.

## 2.6 Set the Bluetooth Name

The Bluetooth name of P7 can be modified, but the number of the characters cannot exceed 32. To do that, please make sure the P7 works under Bluetooth HID mode or Bluetooth SPP mode. Read the barcode "Enter setup", "Set Bluetooth Name", Bluetooth Name (read the barcode of each character in the appendix), and "Exit with save".

For example, steps to set "Tom" as the Bluetooth name are as follows.

1. Read "Enter setup" barcode;
2. Read "Set Bluetooth Name" barcode;
3. Read the character "T" in the appendix;
4. Read the character "o" in the appendix;
5. Read the character "m" in the appendix;
6. Read "Exit with save" barcode.

checksum character or code 11 with two digits checksum character.

If the scanner is set to "Verify with two digits Checksum Character", the scanner will check the data based on the last two characters of the barcode data. It will not be able to read code 11 without checksum character or code 11 with one digit checksum character.

If the scanner is set to "Verify with Output Checksum Character", the scanner will check the data based on the last one or two characters of the barcode data. Inateck P7 default outputs checksum characters.

If the scanner is set to "Verify without Output Checksum Character", the scanner will not output checksum character.

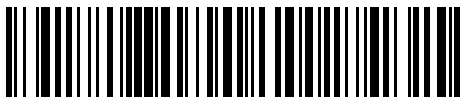

#### 3.15.2 Checksum Verification

Checksum character is not enforced to be included in the data of China Postal Code. If checksum character is included, it should be the last character of the barcode data. As a calculate value

based on all of the data, Checksum character is used to check whether the data is correct or not.

If the scanner is set to "Do Not Verify China Postal Code", which is the default, then the scanner will read all the barcode data.

If the scanner is set to "Verify China Postal Code with Output Checksum Character", and the scanner will check the data based on the last character of the barcode data. If the check passes, the scanner will read and output the Checksum Character as the last character of normal data. However, the scanner will not be able to read China Postal Code without checksum character under this setting.

If the scanner is set to "Verify China Postal Code without Output Checksum Character", and the scanner will check the data based on the last character of the barcode data. If the check passes, the scanner will read but will NOT output the Checksum Character. However the scanner will not be able to read China Postal Code without checksum character under this setting.

### 4.3 Customized Settings of Prefix and Suffix Code of Barcode

Customized 1 to 32 digits prefix / suffix setting is supported by Inateck P7. Though Inateck P7 takes recovering the prefix and suffix as default, Hiding the prefix and suffix is also available through scanning correspondent barcode. Supported prefix/Suffix number can be seen in Appendix 1.

- 5). Read the "1" barcode (see in Appendix 1);
- 6). Read the "Suffix Setting" barcode;

- 8). Read the "@" barcode (see in Appendix 1);
- 9). Read the "D" barcode (see in Appendix 1);
- 10). Read the "Exit with Save" barcode.

Note: Inateck P7 will recover the prefix and suffix automatically once the Prefix/Suffix Setting is finished.

## 4.4 Delete Character(s) on Output Result

Inateck P7 can help users delete 0 to 99 digits from both the beginning and the ending characters before outputs result. As default setting, no character, or 0 digit will be deleted in the output result. More details are as below.

## 4.6 Additional Code

The occurrence of additional code can be found in several types of barcode like EAN-8, EAN-13, ISBN, ISSN, UPC-A and UPC-E. Being 2 or 5 characters, additional code is usually on the right side of the main code but with shorter height. Inateck P7 will only be able to read the main code if additional code is disabled.

### 4.6.1 Two digits Additional Code

Decide whether to read two digits additional code, which applies to EAN-8, EAN-13, ISBN, ISSN, UPC-A and UPC-E, by scanning correspondent barcode below. Inateck P7 defaults to "Disable Two Digits Additional Code".

## 4.8 Short Barcode

Short barcode, which refers to barcodes that equals to or is less than two characters, such as the ITF25, IATA25, Standard 25, Matrix 25, Code 11, MSI, China postal code, Codabar and Code 39 (less than two characters), is supported by Inateck P7. Though disabling the reading of short barcode is taken as default as it would increase the anti-jamming capability of Inateck P7 and prevent error scanning from happening. However, the following setting steps are suggested if unreadable short barcode occurs.

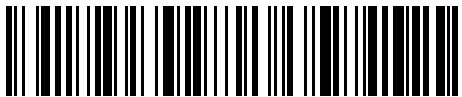

### 4.12 Hide specific start characters

Some specific start characters of code 128 and code 39 are used to indicate a certain product parameter. For example, the start character "P" refers to Part Number, and the start character "Q" refers to Quantity. Inateck P7 can hide these specific start characters of code 128 and code 39, like D, K, P, Q, S, V, 1P, 1T, 10D, 17V, 2P and 4L. After hiding, they won't be output. Inateck P7 defaults "Output the specific start characters".

## 4.13 Time Stamp

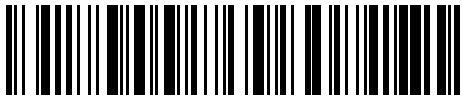

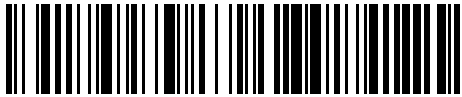

## 4.14 Shortcut Key

The shortcut key refers to outputting the characters or some specific functions displayed in the Appendix. For example, if you scan the barcode "A" in the Appendix, the character "A" will be outputted. If you scan the barcode "Tab" or "Enter", the "Tab" or "Enter" effect will happen. Inateck P7 defaults "Disable Shortcut Key". You can decide whether to enable the Shortcut Key.
